PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 3754

- On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 26 and delete page 2 and insert:
- "SECTION 1. (1) The Oregon Department of Emergency Management and the OregonServes Commission shall collaborate to adapt the volunteer database operated by the commission as described in this section. The database must be adapted and maintained so as to serve as a statewide registry of persons who are able and willing to provide volunteer services related to emergency response. The registry may include:
- "(a) Persons included in the emergency health care provider registry established under ORS 401.654;
- 12 "(b) Persons registered as volunteers with the Department of Hu-13 man Services;
- "(c) Persons registered as volunteers with a local government, as
 defined in ORS 174.116, or tribal entities, including members of community emergency response teams, neighborhood emergency teams
 and volunteer firefighting associations;
- 18 "(d) Current or former first responders;
- 19 "(e) Persons experienced in construction or other skilled trades; and
- 20 "(f) Other persons that the Oregon Department of Emergency
 21 Management determines are able to assist in emergency response.

- "(2) As a condition of inclusion on the registry, the Oregon Department of Emergency Management or the commission may require:
- 3 "(a) Evidence of relevant qualifications; and

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- 4 "(b) Training related to emergency response, including incident 5 management or command.
 - "(3) The registry must include, for each person:
- 7 "(a) The person's name and contact information;
- 8 "(b) The physical location where the person is based; and
- 9 "(c) Specialized training or skills related to emergency response 10 that the person has.
 - "(4) The registry must be accessible to emergency management agencies and emergency program managers described in ORS 401.305. The Oregon Department of Emergency Management or the commission may make the registry accessible to any other persons or entities if the department or commission determines that providing such access will enhance public safety.
 - "(5) The Oregon Department of Emergency Management shall establish procedures for collaborating with appropriate entities, including the Department of Human Services, the Oregon Health Authority and local governments, for the purposes of gathering information for the registry, integrating data from existing databases into the registry and regularly updating the information.
 - "SECTION 2. (1) The Oregon Department of Emergency Management shall administer a statewide foundational training program for volunteers included in the registry established under section 1 of this 2025 Act.
- "(2) The department shall base the training program on the curriculum established by the Emergency Management Institute of the Federal Emergency Management Agency.
 - "(3) The department shall ensure that training is made available to

- persons in all regions of this state. Such training may be provided 1 through remote means. 2
- "(4) The department shall collaborate with entities described in 3 section 1 (5) of this 2025 Act to provide information about the training program to volunteers statewide.
 - "(5) The department may consult with any relevant state agency in administering the training program and shall collaborate with the following state agencies in administering the training program:
 - "(a) The Oregon Health Authority;
 - "(b) The Department of Human Services, including the office of the department responsible for resilience and emergency management;
 - "(c) The Higher Education Coordination Commission;
 - "(d) The Department of Public Safety Standards and Training; and
 - "(e) The Department of the State Fire Marshal.
 - "SECTION 3. It is the policy of the Legislative Assembly that the Joint Committee on Ways and Means shall, during each odd-numbered year regular session of the Legislative Assembly, dedicate a percentage of moneys that are appropriated from the State Treasury but are projected to be unexpended at the end of the biennium to emergency volunteer purposes.".

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
