**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 3169**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, delete “and declaring an
2 emergency” and insert “amending ORS 413.225”.

3 Delete lines 4 through 17 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1.** ORS 413.225 is amended to read:

5 “413.225. (1) As used in this section:

6 “(a) ‘Community health center or safety net clinic’ means a nonprofit
7 medical clinic or school-based health center that provides primary physical
8 health, vision, dental or mental health services to low-income patients with-
9 out charge or using a sliding scale based on the income of the patient.

10 “(b) ‘School-based health center’ means a health clinic that:

11 “(A) Is located on the grounds of a school in a school district or on the
12 grounds of a school operated by a federally recognized Indian tribe or tribal
13 organization;

14 “(B) Is organized through collaboration among schools, communities and
15 health providers, including public health authorities;

16 “(C) Is administered by a county, state, federal or private organization
17 that ensures that certification requirements are met and provides project
18 funding through grants, contracts, billing or other sources of funds;

19 “(D) Is operated exclusively for the purpose of providing health services
20 such as:

21 “(i) Primary care;

1 “(ii) Preventive health care;

2 “(iii) Management and monitoring of chronic health conditions;

3 “(iv) Behavioral health care;

4 “(v) Oral health care;

5 “(vi) Health education services; and

6 “(vii) The administration of vaccines recommended by the Centers for
7 Disease Control and Prevention;

8 “(E) Provides health services to children and adolescents by licensed or
9 certified health professionals; and

10 “(F) May provide one or more health services to children and adolescents
11 by:

12 “(i) A student enrolled in a professional medical, nursing or dental pro-
13 gram at an accredited university if the health service is within the student’s
14 field of study and training; or

15 “(ii) An expanded practice dental hygienist holding a permit issued under
16 ORS 680.200 for oral health care.

17 “(2)(a) The Oregon Health Authority shall award grants to community
18 health centers or safety net clinics, including school-based health centers, to
19 ensure the capacity of each grantee to provide health care services to
20 underserved or vulnerable populations.

21 “(b) The authority shall work with the Centers for Medicare and
22 Medicaid Services and stakeholders to identify additional sources of funding
23 for school-based health center expenditures for which federal financial par-
24 ticipation is available under Title XIX or Title XXI of the Social Security
25 Act.

26 “(3) The authority shall provide outreach for the Cover All People pro-
27 gram, including development and administration of an application assistance
28 program, and including grants to provide funding to organizations and local
29 groups for outreach and enrollment activities for the program, within the
30 limits of funds provided by the Legislative Assembly for this purpose.

1 “(4) The authority shall, using funds allocated by the Legislative Assem-
2 bly:

3 “(a) Provide funds for the expansion and continuation of school-based
4 health centers that are operating on July 29, 2013, and that become certified
5 under ORS 413.223;

6 “(b) Direct funds to communities with certified school-based health cen-
7 ters and to communities planning for certified school-based health centers;
8 and

9 “(c) Create a pool of funds available to provide financial incentives to:

10 “(A) Increase the number of school-based health centers identified as pa-
11 tient centered primary care homes without requiring school-based health
12 centers to be identified as patient centered primary care homes;

13 “(B) Improve the coordination of the care of patients served by coordi-
14 nated care organizations and school-based health centers; and

15 “(C) Improve the effectiveness of the delivery of health services through
16 school-based health centers to children who qualify for medical assistance.

17 **“(5) A school-based health center that receives grant moneys under
18 this section shall certify that the school-based health center:**

19 **“(a) Does not use educational materials that support or reference
20 gender identity as distinct from sex;**

21 **“(b) In any documentation produced by the school-based health
22 center, uses language that reflects binary, biological sex only;**

23 **“(c) Does not provide gender-affirming treatment, as defined in ORS
24 24.500; and**

25 **“(d) Segregates bathrooms and other intimate facilities on the basis
26 of biological sex.**

27 “[5] (6) The authority shall by rule adopt criteria for awarding grants
28 and providing funds in accordance with this section.

29 “[6] (7) The authority shall analyze and evaluate the implementation of
30 the Cover All People program.”.
