1 **SECTION 20.** ORS 822.043 is amended to read:

2 “822.043. (1) As used in this section:

3 “(a) ‘Integrator’ has the meaning given that term in ORS 802.600.

4 “(b) ‘Vehicle dealer’ means a person issued a vehicle dealer certificate
5 under ORS 822.020.

6 “(2) A vehicle dealer that the Department of Transportation has desig-
7 nated to act as an agent of the department under ORS 802.031 may elect to
8 prepare, submit, or prepare and submit documents necessary to:

9 “(a) Issue or transfer a certificate of title for a vehicle;

10 “(b) Register a vehicle or transfer registration of a vehicle;

11 “(c) Issue a registration plate;

12 “(d) Verify and clear a title;

13 “(e) Perfect, release or satisfy a lien or other security interest;

14 “(f) Comply with federal security requirements; or

15 “(g) Render any other services for the purpose of complying with state
16 and federal laws related to the sale of a vehicle.

17 “(3) A vehicle dealer who prepares any documents described in subsection
18 (2) of this section:

19 “(a) May charge a purchaser of a vehicle a document processing fee for
20 the preparation of those documents.

21 “(b) May not charge a purchaser of a vehicle a document processing fee
22 for the submission of any document or the issuance of a registration plate.

23 “(c) May charge a purchaser of a vehicle a document processing fee for
24 performing any of the services described in subsection (2) of this section in
25 connection with preparing the documents described in subsection (2) of this
26 section.

27 **“(4) Other than the portion of the document processing fee a vehicle**
28 **dealer pays to cover the costs of using an integrator under subsection**
29 **(5) of this section,** a purchaser of a vehicle may negotiate the amount of
30 the document processing fee with a vehicle dealer, but in no case shall the

document processing fee charged by a vehicle dealer under this section exceed:

“(a) \$250, if the vehicle dealer uses an integrator; or

“(b) \$200, if the vehicle dealer does not use an integrator.

“(5) If a vehicle dealer charges a document processing fee under subsection (4)(a) of this section, of the amount [*collected*] **charged**, \$35 shall be paid to the integrator.

“(6) Unless otherwise provided by rule, if a vehicle dealer uses an integrator and charges a document processing fee greater than that charged for not using an integrator, the dealer must inform the purchaser of the vehicle of the option of using an integrator to prepare the documents. The purchaser may then elect whether or not to have the vehicle dealer use an integrator to prepare the documents.

“(7) If the purchaser of a vehicle pays a document processing fee, the vehicle dealer shall prepare and submit all documents to complete the transaction as permitted by law.

“(8)(a) A vehicle dealer who collects the privilege tax imposed under ORS 320.405 from the purchaser of a taxable motor vehicle may collect the privilege tax at the same time and in the same manner as the vehicle dealer collects document processing fees under this section. The amount of the privilege tax shall be in addition to and not in lieu of document processing fees collected under this section.

“(b) A vehicle dealer may exclude the amount of the privilege tax from the capitalized cost and offering price of a taxable motor vehicle as those terms are defined by the Department of Justice by rule.

“(9) Except as provided in subsection (10) of this section, before finalizing a retail sales transaction a vehicle dealer shall:

“(a)(A) If the vehicle is subject to the reporting requirements of the National Motor Vehicle Title Information System, conduct a vehicle record search using the National Motor Vehicle Title Information

1 **System; or**

2 **“(B) Conduct a vehicle record search using an equivalent commer-**
3 **cially available system to the National Motor Vehicle Title Informa-**
4 **tion System that, at a minimum, maintains records from those states**
5 **participating in data sharing with the National Motor Vehicle Title**
6 **Information System;**

7 **“(b) Verify the title information; and**

8 **“(c) Inform the retail customer of any brand, defect or irregularity**
9 **found in the search that could impact the vehicle’s value.**

10 **“(10) Subsection (9) of this section does not apply when a vehicle is**
11 **sold with a salvage title certificate or with a document issued by an-**
12 **other state with a title brand, as defined by the Department of**
13 **Transportation by rule.”.**

28 **“SECTION 37. ORS 822.133 is amended to read:**

29 **“822.133. (1) As used in this section:**

30 **“(a) ‘Crushed motor vehicle’ means a motor vehicle, the frame or unibody**

1 of which is compacted or flattened so that it no longer resembles any par-
2 ticular year, model or make of motor vehicle and is less than half of the
3 motor vehicle's original volume as measured in cubic feet.

4 “(b) ‘Destroy’ means to dismantle, disassemble[,] **or** damage [*or substan-*
5 *tially alter*] a motor vehicle:

6 “(A) With the intent of rendering the vehicle permanently inoperable;

7 “(B) To the extent that the cost of repairing the vehicle exceeds the ac-
8 tual cash value of the vehicle prior to the damage; or

9 “(C) To the extent that the sum of the cost of repairing the vehicle and
10 the salvage value of the vehicle in its damaged condition exceeds the actual
11 cash value of the vehicle in its repaired condition.

12 “(c) ‘Mobile motor vehicle crusher’ means a machine that compacts or
13 flattens a motor vehicle into a crushed motor vehicle and is designed to be
14 transported on a highway.

15 “(d) ‘Wrecked vehicle’ means a motor vehicle:

16 “(A) That is destroyed, or is acquired with the intent to destroy, and that
17 will never be operated as a motor vehicle; or

18 “(B) That has sustained damage to an extent that the vehicle may not
19 lawfully be operated on the highways of this state.

20 “(2) In the operation of a motor vehicle dismantling business, a
21 dismantler:

22 “(a) Must physically separate or visually label a wrecked vehicle in a
23 manner that readily identifies the ownership status of the wrecked vehicle
24 if the dismantler takes possession of the wrecked vehicle without imme-
25 diately obtaining an ownership record or salvage title certificate. A
26 dismantler need not separate or visually identify a wrecked vehicle pursuant
27 to this subsection if the vehicle is subject to an exemption under ORS 803.030
28 or is obtained from a jurisdiction that does not issue certificates of title.

29 “(b) May not remove parts from or destroy a motor vehicle prior to ob-
30 taining an ownership record or salvage title certificate for the vehicle.

1 “(c) Must demolish the registration plates of a wrecked vehicle at the
2 time the ownership record is received.

3 “(d) Must notify the Department of Transportation of any changes in the
4 information provided to the department in the application for a dismantler
5 certificate within 30 days of the change.

6 “(e) Must furnish a written report to the department, in a form estab-
7 lished by the department by rule, after a wrecked vehicle is dismantled or
8 destroyed.

9 “(f) Must, every year, have the premises inspected by local fire inspectors
10 and furnish a written report to the department, in a form established by the
11 department by rule, on the findings of the inspection.

12 “(g) Must be in compliance with any agreement with, order of or program
13 or process authorized by the Department of Environmental Quality that
14 governs the conduct of the dismantler.

15 “(3)(a) A dismantler using a mobile motor vehicle crusher shall:

16 “(A) Hold a current, valid dismantler certificate issued under ORS
17 822.110.

18 “(B) Conspicuously display on the mobile motor vehicle crusher the name
19 of the dismantler’s business as listed on the dismantler’s application sub-
20 mitted pursuant to ORS 822.110 and the dismantler certificate number issued
21 by the Department of Transportation.

22 “(C) Comply with all of the applicable statutes and rules regulating
23 dismantlers at each location where the dismantler uses the mobile motor
24 vehicle crusher. If the dismantler is using a mobile motor vehicle crusher
25 at a location approved under a dismantler certificate, the dismantler who
26 holds the dismantler certificate for the location shall be responsible for
27 complying with all statutes and rules regarding dismantlers.

28 “(b) If a dismantler is using a mobile motor vehicle crusher at a tempo-
29 rary location for 15 consecutive business days or less, the dismantler is ex-
30 empt from obtaining a supplemental dismantler certificate under ORS 822.125

1 for the temporary location.

2 **“SECTION 38.** ORS 822.135 is amended to read:

3 “822.135. (1) A person commits the offense of improperly conducting a
4 motor vehicle dismantling business if the person holds a dismantler certifi-
5 cate issued under ORS 822.110 and the person does any of the following:

6 “(a) Fails to permanently exhibit a dismantler certificate at a place of
7 business of the person at all times while the certificate is in force.

8 “(b) Expands the dimensions of or moves any of the person’s places of
9 business or opens any additional places of business without obtaining a
10 supplemental dismantler certificate by the procedure under ORS 822.125.

11 “(c) Fails to maintain records at the person’s established place of business
12 that record and describe the following:

13 “(A) Every motor vehicle purchased, transferred, wrecked, dismantled,
14 disassembled or substantially altered by the person;

15 “(B) The name and address of the person to and from whom the vehicle
16 was transferred;

17 “(C) The vehicle identification number and other identification marks or
18 numbers on the vehicle; and

19 “(D) A statement indicating any such numbers or marks that have been
20 obliterated, defaced or changed.

21 “(d) Except as otherwise provided, fails to surrender to the Department
22 of Transportation, within 30 days after the date the person acquires the title,
23 a certificate of title or other primary ownership document or ownership re-
24 cord for a motor vehicle. If the vehicle is delivered to the person under the
25 provisions of ORS 819.215 or 819.280, a copy of the notification to the de-
26 partment under ORS 819.215 or 819.280 is sufficient to comply with the pro-
27 visions of this paragraph.

28 “(e) Refuses, at any time, to allow a police officer or an employee of the
29 department to inspect the books, records, inventory or premises of the
30 person’s motor vehicle dismantling business.

1 “(f) Fails to maintain, for the purposes of the person’s motor vehicle dis-
2 mantling business, a building or an enclosure or other barrier at least six
3 feet in height that is constructed, established or formed in compliance with
4 rules adopted by the department.

5 “(g) Fails to keep the premises on the outside of the establishment clear
6 and clean at all times.

7 “(h) Conducts any wrecking, dismantling or altering of vehicles outside
8 the building, enclosure or barrier on the premises of the business.

9 “(i) Stores or displays any motor vehicles or major component parts or
10 conducts the motor vehicle dismantling business outside of the building, en-
11 closure or barrier of the place of business.

12 “(j) Fails to immediately file with the department, upon transfer of a
13 wrecked or dismantled motor vehicle **to another person who holds a**
14 **dismantler certificate**, the form furnished by the department to report the
15 date of transfer, a description of the vehicle, the name and address of the
16 [purchaser] **purchasing dismantler** and other information respecting the
17 vehicle required by the department.

18 “(k) Except as otherwise provided in this paragraph, fails to keep the
19 business hidden or adequately screened by the terrain or other natural ob-
20 jects or by plantings, fences or other appropriate means so as not to be vis-
21 ible from the main traveled way of the highway in accordance with the rules
22 of the Director of Transportation. This paragraph does not apply to a busi-
23 ness that is:

24 “(A) Located in an area zoned for industrial use under authority of the
25 laws of this state; or

26 “(B) A business established before June 30, 1967.

27 “(L) Expands or moves any place of business approved under a dismantler
28 certificate or opens any additional locations for the business without ob-
29 taining a supplemental certificate under ORS 822.125 or obtaining an addi-
30 tional dismantler certificate.

1 “(m) Fails to allow the department to conduct inspections as provided
2 under ORS 822.130.

3 “(n) Fails to deploy or remove any air bag containing sodium azide from
4 a vehicle before the vehicle is wrecked or dismantled.

5 “(o) Fails to ensure that an air bag containing sodium azide that has been
6 removed from a vehicle is deployed within seven days of removal unless the
7 air bag is properly stored by a motor vehicle dealer, automobile repair fa-
8 cility or dismantler certified under ORS 822.110.

9 “(2) The offense described in this section, improperly conducting a motor
10 vehicle dismantling business, is a:

11 “(a) Class A misdemeanor if the person violates subsection (1)(a) to (m)
12 of this section.

13 “(b) Class D violation if the person violates subsection (1)(n) or (o) of this
14 section.

15 “(c) Class C misdemeanor, notwithstanding paragraph (b) of this sub-
16 section, if the person violates subsection (1)(n) or (o) of this section and the
17 person has two or more previous convictions for violating subsection (1)(n)
18 or (o) of this section.

19 **“SECTION 39.** ORS 822.137 is amended to read:

20 “822.137. (1) As used in this section **and ORS 822.135**, ‘major component
21 part’ includes significant parts of a motor vehicle such as engines, short
22 blocks, frames, transmissions, transfer cases, cabs, doors, differentials, front
23 or rear clips, quarter panels, truck beds or boxes, hoods, bumpers, fenders,
24 catalytic converters and airbags. The Department of Transportation may by
25 rule designate other motor vehicle parts not specified in this subsection as
26 major component parts. ‘Major component part’ does not include cores or
27 parts of cores that require remanufacturing or that are limited in value to
28 that of scrap metal.

29 “(2) In addition to any other penalty provided by law, the department may
30 impose on a dismantler, in the manner provided by ORS 183.745, a civil

1 penalty not to exceed \$1,000 per violation if the dismantler:

2 “(a) Acquires a motor vehicle or major component part without obtaining
3 a certificate of sale and, if applicable, a certificate of title.

4 “(b) Acquires a catalytic converter or a component of a catalytic con-
5 verter, that has been removed from a vehicle and is offered for sale as an
6 independent item, separate and distinct from a vehicle acquisition, whether
7 individually or as part of a bundle, bale or in other bulk form.

8 “(c) Possesses, sells or otherwise disposes of a motor vehicle or any part
9 of a motor vehicle knowing that the vehicle or part has been stolen.

10 “(d) Sells, buys, receives, conceals, possesses or disposes of a motor vehi-
11 cle or any part of a motor vehicle having a missing, defaced, intentionally
12 altered or covered vehicle identification number, unless directed to do so by
13 a law enforcement official.

14 “(e) Commits forgery in the second degree, as defined in ORS 165.007, or
15 misstates a material fact relating to a certificate of title, registration or
16 other document related to a motor vehicle that has been reassembled from
17 parts of other motor vehicles.

18 “(f) Fraudulently obtains, creates or modifies a dismantler certificate.

19 “(g) Fails to maintain records at the certified place of business for three
20 years from the date of acquisition of a motor vehicle that describe and
21 identify the vehicle, including:

22 “(A) The certificate of title number;

23 “(B) The state where the vehicle was last registered, if applicable;

24 “(C) The number of the last registration plate issued and the state of is-
25 suance, if applicable;

26 “(D) The year, make and model of the vehicle;

27 “(E) The vehicle identification number;

28 “(F) The date acquired;

29 “(G) The vehicle, stock or yard number assigned to the vehicle by the
30 dismantler; and

1 “(H) Any other information required by the department.

2 “(h) Fails to maintain records at the certified place of business for three
3 years from the date of acquisition of a major component part that describe
4 and identify the part, including:

5 “(A) The physical characteristics of the part;

6 “(B) The stock or yard number assigned to the part by the dismantler;

7 “(C) The vehicle identification number of the motor vehicle from which
8 the part came;

9 “(D) Transaction documents regarding the sale or disposal of a catalytic
10 converter, including documents that show the transaction date, dollar
11 amount, stock or yard number assigned to the catalytic converter and the
12 signatures of buyer and seller; and

13 “(E) Any other information required by the department.

14 “(i) Commits a dishonest act or omission during the sale of a motor ve-
15 hicle or major component part that, as determined by the department, causes
16 a loss to the purchaser.

17 “(j) Is convicted of a crime involving false statements or dishonesty that
18 directly relates to the business of the dismantler or suffers any civil judg-
19 ment imposed for conduct involving fraud, misrepresentation or conversion.

20 “(k) Fails to comply with any provision of ORS 822.133.”.

29 **“SECTION 46. ORS 806.220 is repealed.**

30 **“SECTION 47. ORS 806.240 is amended to read:**

1 “806.240. Future responsibility filings required by ORS 806.200[, 806.220]
2 or 806.230 or by any other law of this state are subject to all of the following:

3 “(1) Except as provided in subsection (3) of this section, the person re-
4 quired to make the filing must file with the Department of Transportation,
5 or have filed with the department for the benefit of the person, proof of
6 compliance that meets the requirements of this section and must maintain
7 the proof of compliance as required under ORS 806.245. The filing is made
8 on the date it is received by the department if it is received during regular
9 business hours.

10 “(2) The proof of compliance filed under subsection (1) of this section
11 must be:

12 “(a) A certificate or certificates of insurance that meet the requirements
13 under ORS 806.270; or

14 “(b) A valid certificate of self-insurance issued by the department under
15 ORS 806.130.

16 “(3) The owner of a motor vehicle may make a future responsibility filing
17 under this section on behalf of the owner’s employee or a member of the
18 owner’s immediate family or household in lieu of the filing being made by
19 the person. Filing under this subsection permits the person on whose behalf
20 the filing is made to operate only a motor vehicle covered by the proof of
21 compliance given in the filing. The department shall endorse restrictions, as
22 appropriate, on any license or driver permit the person holds as the depart-
23 ment determines necessary to limit the person’s ability to operate vehicles
24 consistent with this subsection.

25 “(4) Whenever proof of compliance filed under this section no longer
26 meets the requirements of this section, the department shall require the
27 furnishing of other proof of compliance for the future responsibility filing.
28 If other proof of compliance is not furnished, the department shall suspend
29 the driving privileges of the person as provided under ORS 809.415.

1 **“DRIVER RECORDS**

2

3 **“SECTION 48.** ORS 802.200 is amended to read:

4 “802.200. In addition to any other records the Department of Transporta-
5 tion may establish, the department is subject to the following provisions
6 concerning records:

7 “(1) The department shall maintain records concerning the titling of ve-
8 hicles in this state. The records under this subsection shall include the fol-
9 lowing:

10 “(a) For vehicles issued a title by this state, the records shall identify the
11 vehicle and contain the following:

12 “(A) The name of the vehicle owner and any security interest holders in
13 order of priority, except that a security interest holder need not be identified
14 if the debtor who granted the interest is in the business of selling vehicles
15 and the vehicles constitute inventory held for sale;

16 “(B) The name of any lessor of the vehicle;

17 “(C) The vehicle description; and

18 “(D) Whether a certificate of title was issued for the vehicle.

19 “(b) If the vehicle is an antique vehicle that is reconstructed, the records
20 shall indicate that the vehicle is reconstructed.

21 “(c) If the vehicle is a replica, the records shall indicate that the vehicle
22 is a replica.

23 “(d) Any other information concerning the titling of vehicles that the
24 department considers convenient or appropriate.

25 “(e) All odometer disclosures and readings for a vehicle that are reported
26 to the department under provisions of the vehicle code. The department shall
27 keep the most recent version of records required under this paragraph in
28 electronic form.

29 “(f) If the vehicle has been reported to the department as a totaled vehicle
30 under the provisions of ORS 819.012 or 819.014, the records shall indicate

1 that the vehicle is a totaled vehicle unless the reason for the report was
2 theft and the vehicle has been recovered.

3 “(2) If a vehicle that has been registered or titled in another jurisdiction
4 is registered or titled in this state, the department shall retain a record of
5 any odometer readings shown on the title or registration documents submit-
6 ted to the department at the time of registration or title.

7 “(3) Except as otherwise provided in ORS 826.003, the department shall
8 maintain records concerning the registration of vehicles required to be reg-
9 istered by the department. The records concerning the registration of vehi-
10 cles may be stored along with records concerning the titling of vehicles. The
11 records under this subsection shall include the following:

12 “(a) For vehicles registered by the department, the records shall identify
13 the vehicle and contain the following:

14 “(A) The registration plate number assigned by the department to the
15 vehicle;

16 “(B) The name of the vehicle owner;

17 “(C) The vehicle description and vehicle identification number; and

18 “(D) An indication that the vehicle is a totaled vehicle if it has been re-
19 ported to the department as a totaled vehicle under the provisions of ORS
20 819.012 or 819.014, unless the reason for the report was theft and the vehicle
21 has been recovered.

22 “(b) Any other information concerning the registration of vehicles that
23 the department considers convenient or appropriate.

24 “(4) The department shall maintain separate records for the regulation
25 of vehicle dealers. The records required under this subsection shall include
26 the following information about persons issued dealer certificates:

27 “(a) The person’s application for a vehicle dealer certificate.

28 “(b) An alphabetical index of the name of each person applying for a ve-
29 hicle dealer certificate.

30 “(c) A numerical index according to the distinctive number assigned to

1 each vehicle dealer.

2 “(5) The department shall maintain a file on vehicles for which the title
3 record is canceled under ORS 819.030. The records required under this sub-
4 section shall disclose the last registered owner of each vehicle, any security
5 interest holder or holders and lessors of each vehicle as shown by the can-
6 celed title record for each vehicle and the make and year model for each
7 vehicle.

8 “(6) The department shall maintain a record of each agreement or decla-
9 ration under ORS 802.500 and 802.520.

10 “(7) The department shall maintain separate and comprehensive records
11 of all transactions affecting the Revolving Account for Emergency Cash
12 Advances described under ORS 802.100.

13 “(8) The department shall maintain suitable records of driver licenses,
14 driver permits and identification cards. The records required under this
15 subsection shall include all of the following:

16 “(a) An index by name and number.

17 “(b) Supporting documentation of all driver licenses, driver permits or
18 identification cards issued.

19 “(c) Every application for a driver license, driver permit or identification
20 card.

21 “(d) All driver licenses, [or] driver permits **or identification cards** that
22 have been suspended, revoked or canceled.

23 “(e)(A) For each driver license, driver permit or identification card, the
24 Social Security number of the person to whom the driver license, driver
25 permit or identification card is issued or the written statement that the
26 person has not been assigned a Social Security number.

27 “(B) As used in this paragraph, a ‘driver license,’ ‘driver permit’ or
28 ‘identification card’ means a driver license, driver permit or identification
29 card that is not a:

30 “(i) Real ID;

1 “(ii) Commercial driver license; or

2 “(iii) Commercial learner driver permit.

3 “(f) For each commercial driver license and commercial learner driver
4 permit, the Social Security number of the person to whom the license or
5 permit is issued, or any other number or identifying information that the
6 Secretary of the United States Department of Transportation determines ap-
7 propriate to identify the person.

8 “(g) For each Real ID, the Social Security number of the person to whom
9 the Real ID is issued, or proof that the person is not eligible for a Social
10 Security number.

11 “(h) Emergency contact information provided under ORS 802.275.

12 “(9) The Department of Transportation shall maintain a two-part driving
13 record consisting of an employment driving record and a nonemployment
14 driving record for each person as required under this subsection. All of the
15 following apply to the records required under this subsection:

16 “(a) The department shall maintain driving records *[on]* **for** each person
17 the department determines requires an Oregon driving record to comply with
18 federal regulations or provisions of the vehicle code. **The department may**
19 **establish and maintain driving records for each person without an**
20 **Oregon driving record when the department requests or receives in-**
21 **formation ordinarily maintained as part of the driving record.** The de-
22 partment shall *[establish]* **adopt** rules for maintaining driving records under
23 this subsection.

24 “(b) In addition to other information required by this paragraph, the em-
25 ployment driving record shall include all reports of drug test results that are
26 made to the department under ORS 825.410 or 825.415. Notwithstanding any
27 other provision of law, release of the portion of the employment driving re-
28 cord that shows drug test results reported under ORS 825.410 or 825.415 is
29 permitted only in accordance with ORS 802.202. The employment driving re-
30 cord shall also include all motor vehicle accidents that the person is required

1 to report under ORS 811.720, all suspensions of driving privileges required
2 to be placed on the record under ORS 809.280, all suspensions of the person's
3 commercial driving privileges that result from operation or use of a com-
4 mercial motor vehicle and all convictions, as determined by the department
5 by rule, of the person for violation of motor vehicle laws except convictions
6 for offenses requiring mandatory revocation or suspension of driving privi-
7 leges under ORS 809.409, 809.411, 809.510 to 809.545 and 813.400, but shall
8 include only such accidents, suspensions and convictions that occur while
9 the person is driving a motor vehicle:

10 "(A) In the course of the person's employment when the person is em-
11 ployed by another for the principal purpose of driving a motor vehicle;

12 "(B) Carrying persons or property for compensation;

13 "(C) In the course of the person's employment in the collection, trans-
14 portation or delivery of mail if the vehicle is government owned or marked
15 for the collection, transportation or delivery of mail in accordance with
16 government rules;

17 "(D) That is an authorized emergency vehicle;

18 "(E) That is a commercial motor vehicle; or

19 "(F) In the course of the person's employment with a federal, state or lo-
20 cal government in a public works project involving repair or maintenance
21 of water, sewer or road systems.

22 "(c) The nonemployment driving record shall include the person's:

23 "(A) Motor vehicle accidents that the person is required to report under
24 ORS 811.720, other than the motor vehicle accidents that are included on the
25 person's employment driving record;

26 "(B) Suspensions, cancellations and revocations of **driver** licenses, **driver**
27 permits, [and] driving privileges **and the right to apply for driving privi-**
28 **leges;**

29 "(C) Judgments and convictions, as determined by the department by rule,
30 for violation of the motor vehicle laws including, for each violation of ORS

1 811.100 or 811.111, the speed at which the person was convicted of traveling
2 and the posted speed, the speed limit or the speed that constitutes prima
3 facie evidence of violation of the basic speed rule, as appropriate; and

4 “(D) Diversion agreements entered into under ORS 813.220 within the
5 preceding 15 years.

6 “(d) The department may record other entries to indicate correspondence,
7 interviews, participation in driver improvement programs or other matters
8 concerning the status of the driving privileges of the person.

9 “(e) When **the department establishes a driving record for a person,**
10 **or when** a person is issued a driver license or driver permit by this state,
11 the department may request **or receive** a copy of driving records that exist
12 for the person in any other jurisdiction. The department shall adopt rules
13 specifying when the department may request **or receive** driving records from
14 other jurisdictions and may apply entries from [*out-of-state*] **the records of**
15 **other jurisdictions** for use in Oregon.

16 “(f) When a suspension of a driver permit, driver license or other driving
17 privilege is placed on the driving record under ORS 809.280 for failure to
18 appear in court on a traffic crime, the department shall note on the record
19 that the suspension was for failure to appear in court and shall also note the
20 offense charged against the person on which the person failed to appear.

21 “(g) The Department of Transportation, in consultation with the Depart-
22 ment of State Police, shall devise and implement a method of noting sus-
23 pensions and revocations of driving privileges on the record in such a way
24 that police agencies can determine directly from the record what class of
25 offense, as provided by law, is committed by a person who drives in violation
26 of the suspension or revocation. If the Department of Transportation and the
27 Department of State Police devise a mutually agreeable alternative method
28 of informing police agencies of the nature of a suspension or revocation and
29 the consequences of its violation, the implementation of that method shall
30 satisfy the duty of the Department of Transportation under this paragraph.

1 “(10) The department shall maintain accident reports filed with the de-
2 partment under ORS 810.460 and 811.725 to 811.735.

3 “(11) The department shall maintain records of bank checks or money
4 orders returned under ORS 802.110.

5 “(12) The department shall maintain records of trip permits issued by the
6 department under ORS 803.600, as provided under this subsection. The re-
7 cords required by this subsection shall include the following:

8 “(a) A description of the vehicle sufficient to identify the vehicle.

9 “(b) The person to whom the permit was issued.

10 “(c) When the permit was issued.

11 “(d) The type of permit issued.

12 “(e) For registration weight trip permits, the maximum allowable regis-
13 tration weight permitted for operation under the permit.

14 “(f) Any other information the department determines appropriate or
15 convenient.

16 **“SECTION 49.** ORS 802.220 is amended to read:

17 “802.220. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection and ORS
18 802.177, the records the Department of Transportation maintains under ORS
19 802.200 on vehicles are public records. The records of vehicles registered
20 under ORS 805.060 are not public records and are exempt from public in-
21 spection as provided under ORS 181A.220 and are for the confidential use of
22 criminal justice agencies described under ORS 181A.010. The department may
23 charge the fee established under ORS 802.230 for furnishing information un-
24 der this section concerning a vehicle or its owner.

25 “(2) The department may charge the fee established under ORS 802.230 for
26 furnishing to the public information from the records the department main-
27 tains under ORS 802.200 concerning driver licenses or driver permits.

28 “(3) The records the department keeps under ORS 802.200 on judgments
29 or convictions under ORS 810.375 shall be open to the inspection of any
30 person during reasonable business hours. Nothing in this subsection author-

1 izes the release of personal information as defined in ORS 802.175.

2 “(4) The department shall upon request furnish any person certified ab-
3 stracts of the employment driving record and the nonemployment driving
4 record of any person whose driving records are maintained under ORS
5 802.200. If an abstract of the employment driving record is not specifically
6 requested, the department shall only furnish an abstract of the nonemploy-
7 ment driving record. Nothing in this subsection authorizes the release of
8 personal information as defined in ORS 802.175. The department shall collect
9 the fee established for abstracts of driving records under ORS 802.230. A
10 certified abstract issued under this section shall not contain any of the fol-
11 lowing, unless the abstract is being requested under ORS 746.265 (3):

12 “(a) Any accident or conviction for violation of motor vehicles laws that
13 occurred more than three years immediately preceding a request for abstract.

14 “(b) Any suspension ordered under ORS 809.220 after the department has
15 received notice to reinstate a person’s suspended driving privileges under
16 ORS 809.220.

17 “(c) Any diversion agreement under ORS 813.220 entered into more than
18 three years immediately preceding a request for the abstract.

19 “(5) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, accident reports filed
20 with the department under ORS 811.725, 811.730 or 811.735 shall be without
21 prejudice to the individual filing the report and shall be for the confidential
22 use of state administrative and enforcement agencies. The department may
23 use the confidential accident reports to provide the following information to
24 the persons described:

25 “(a) Upon request, the department shall disclose the following information
26 to any party involved in the accident or to their personal representative or
27 any member of the family of a party involved in the accident:

28 “(A) The identity of the owner, driver, occupants and the registration
29 number of a vehicle involved in the accident;

30 “(B) The names of any companies insuring the owner or driver of a ve-

1 hicle involved in the accident; and

2 “(C) The names of any witnesses to the accident.

3 “(b) The department shall furnish a certificate showing that a specified
4 accident report has or has not been made to the department upon demand
5 of any person who has or claims to have made such a report or upon demand
6 of a court.

7 “**(6) The department may furnish a driving record maintained by the**
8 **department under ORS 802.200 to another jurisdiction upon request of**
9 **the other jurisdiction.**

10 “[~~(6)~~] **(7)** The department shall tabulate and may analyze all accident re-
11 ports to develop statistical information based thereon as to the number and
12 circumstances of traffic accidents. The department shall publish information
13 compiled under this section in the manner provided under ORS 802.050.

14 “[~~(7)~~] **(8)** Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the records the
15 department is required under ORS 802.200 to maintain on trip permits issued
16 under ORS 803.600 are public records. The department may charge a fee es-
17 tablished under ORS 802.230 for furnishing information from the records on
18 trip permits. Nothing in this subsection authorizes the release of personal
19 information as defined in ORS 802.175.

20 “[~~(8)~~] **(9)** The records the department maintains under ORS 802.200 con-
21 cerning odometer readings for vehicles are public records. The department
22 may separately furnish information concerning odometer readings shown by
23 its records. The department may charge the fee established under ORS
24 802.230 for information separately provided under this subsection. Nothing
25 in this subsection authorizes the release of personal information as defined
26 in ORS 802.175.

27
28 **“COMMERCIAL DRIVING PRIVILEGES**

29
30 **“SECTION 50. ORS 809.520 is amended to read:**

1 “809.520. (1) [*Notwithstanding ORS 809.510 (1) to (5) and (7),*] The De-
2 partment of Transportation shall permanently suspend a person’s commercial
3 driving privileges for the lifetime of the person if the department receives a
4 record of conviction for a crime punishable as a felony in which a motor
5 vehicle was used and that involved the manufacturing, distributing or dis-
6 pensing of a controlled substance, as defined in ORS 475.005. The department
7 may not reinstate commercial driving privileges of a person whose commer-
8 cial driving privileges are suspended under this subsection.

9 “(2) [*Notwithstanding ORS 809.510 (1) to (5) and (7),*] The department shall
10 permanently suspend a person’s commercial driving privileges for the lifetime
11 of the person if the department receives a record of conviction for a crime
12 in which a commercial motor vehicle was used and that involved an act or
13 practice of severe forms of trafficking in persons as defined by the depart-
14 ment by rule. The department may not reinstate commercial driving privi-
15 leges of a person whose commercial driving privileges are suspended under
16 this subsection.

17 “(3)(a) [*Notwithstanding ORS 809.510 (1) to (5) and (7),*] The department
18 shall suspend a person’s commercial driving privileges for the lifetime of the
19 person if the department receives a second or subsequent record, report or
20 notice described in ORS 809.510 [*(1) to (5) and (7)*] that does not arise out
21 of the same incident and that would be grounds for suspension of the
22 person’s commercial driving privileges under ORS 809.510 [*(1) to (5) and*
23 *(7)*].

24 “(b) The department may adopt rules providing for the reinstatement of
25 commercial driving privileges suspended under this subsection. The depart-
26 ment may not reinstate commercial driving **privileges** [*privilege*
27 *suspensions*] under this subsection earlier than 10 years after the date that
28 the person’s commercial driving privileges are suspended under paragraph (a)
29 of this subsection.

30 “(c) The department shall permanently suspend a person’s commercial

1 driving privileges for the lifetime of the person if the department receives a
2 record, report or notice described in paragraph (a) of this subsection that
3 relates to conduct that occurred after the person's commercial driving priv-
4 ileges were reinstated under paragraph (b) of this subsection. The department
5 may not reinstate the commercial driving privileges of a person whose com-
6 mercial driving privileges are suspended under this paragraph.

7 **“(4) The department shall suspend a person’s commercial driving**
8 **privileges under this section if the department receives a notice of a**
9 **conviction in another jurisdiction of an offense that, if committed in**
10 **this state, would be grounds for suspending the person’s commercial**
11 **driving privileges under this section. The department’s authority to**
12 **reinstate a person’s commercial driving privileges under this section**
13 **is the same as if the conviction were for an offense committed in this**
14 **state. For the purposes of this subsection, ‘conviction’ has the mean-**
15 **ing given that term in ORS 809.510 (6).**

16 **“[(4)] (5)** A suspension imposed under this section is consecutive to any
17 other suspension imposed under ORS 809.510, 809.525, 809.530 or 809.535, if
18 the suspensions do not arise out of the same incident.

19 20 **“ADVANCED CLEAN TRUCKS REGULATIONS**

21
22 **“SECTION 51. (1) As used in this section, ‘Advanced Clean Trucks**
23 **regulations’ means the portion of the California Low Emission Vehicle**
24 **program that was first adopted by the California Air Resources Board**
25 **in 2021, and which would require manufacturers of medium-duty and**
26 **heavy-duty motor vehicles to sell an increasing percentage of zero-**
27 **emissions vehicles.**

28 **“(2) Notwithstanding ORS 468A.360 or any other provision of law,**
29 **the Department of Environmental Quality may not implement or en-**
30 **force the Advanced Clean Trucks regulations, as adopted by the En-**

1 vironmental Quality Commission, before January 1, 2027.

21 **“SECTION 54. This 2025 Act being necessary for the immediate**
22 **preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is**
23 **declared to exist, and this 2025 Act takes effect on its passage.”.**
