**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 1066**

1 In line 2 of the printed bill, delete “section 3” and insert “sections 3 and
2 9”.

3 In line 3, delete “repealing section 9, chapter 91, Oregon Laws 2022;”.

4 Delete lines 5 through 20 and insert:

5 **“SECTION 1.** Section 3, chapter 91, Oregon Laws 2022, as amended by
6 section 8, chapter 92, Oregon Laws 2024, is amended to read:

7 **“Sec. 3.** Notwithstanding any provision of the state building code, as de-
8 fined in ORS 455.010, a single-family detached dwelling that is used to oper-
9 ate a residential training home, as defined in ORS 443.400, or an adult foster
10 home, as defined in ORS 443.705, is not required to have installed an auto-
11 matic sprinkler system if:

12 “(1) The dwelling has been operated as a residential training home or an
13 adult foster home pursuant to a license issued prior to July 1, [2026] **2028**;

14 “(2) The operator is licensed to serve five or fewer individuals in the
15 dwelling; and

16 “(3) The operator and the dwelling meet all other fire, life and safety re-
17 quirements established by the Department of Human Services or the Oregon
18 Health Authority by rule.

19 **“SECTION 2.** Section 9, chapter 91, Oregon Laws 2022, as amended by
20 section 9, chapter 92, Oregon Laws 2024, is amended to read:

21 **“Sec. 9.** Section 3, chapter 91, Oregon Laws 2022, is repealed on January

1 2, [2027] **2029**.

2 **“SECTION 3. This 2025 Act being necessary for the immediate**
3 **preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is**
4 **declared to exist, and this 2025 Act takes effect on its passage.”.**

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
