**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 3626**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 4, delete “, 815.280”.

2 On page 7, delete lines 3 through 45.

3 On page 8, delete lines 1 through 42 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 8. ORS 807.020, as amended by section 3, chapter 12, Oregon**
5 **Laws 2024, is amended to read:**

6 “807.020. A person who is granted a driving privilege by this section may
7 exercise the driving privilege described without violation of the requirements
8 under ORS 807.010. A grant of driving privileges to operate a motor vehicle
9 under this section is subject to suspension and revocation the same as other
10 driving privileges granted under the vehicle code. This section is in addition
11 to any exemptions from the vehicle code under ORS 801.026. The following
12 persons are granted the described driving privileges:

13 “(1) A person who is not a resident of this state or who has been a resi-
14 dent of this state for less than 30 days may operate a motor vehicle without
15 an Oregon license or driver permit if the person holds a current out-of-state
16 license issued to the person. For the purpose of this subsection, a person is
17 a resident of this state if the person meets the residency requirements de-
18 scribed in ORS 807.062. To qualify under this subsection, the person must
19 have the out-of-state license or driver permit in the person’s possession. A
20 person is not granted driving privileges under this subsection:

21 “(a) If the person is under the minimum age required to be eligible for

1 driving privileges under ORS 807.060;

2 “(b) During a period of suspension or revocation by this state or any
3 other jurisdiction of driving privileges or of the right to apply for a license
4 or driver permit issued by this state or any other jurisdiction; or

5 “(c) That exceed the driving privileges granted to the person by the out-
6 of-state license or driver permit.

7 “(2) A person who is a member of the Armed Forces of the United States
8 or a member of the commissioned corps of the National Oceanic and Atmo-
9 spheric Administration may operate a motor vehicle without an Oregon li-
10 cense or driver permit if the person is operating a motor vehicle in the
11 course of the person’s duties in the Armed Forces or the National Oceanic
12 and Atmospheric Administration.

13 “(3) A person without a license or driver permit may operate a road roller
14 or road machinery that is not required to be registered under the laws of this
15 state.

16 “(4) A person without a license or driver permit may temporarily operate,
17 draw, move or propel a farm tractor or implement of husbandry.

18 “(5) A person without a license or driver permit may operate a motor
19 vehicle to demonstrate driving ability during the course of an examination
20 administered under ORS 807.070 for the purpose of qualifying for a license
21 or driver permit. This subsection only applies when an authorized examiner
22 is in a seat beside the driver of the motor vehicle.

23 “(6) Driving privileges for snowmobiles are exclusively as provided in
24 ORS 821.150.

25 “(7) Driving privileges for Class I all-terrain vehicles are exclusively as
26 provided in ORS 821.170, unless a person is operating a Class I all-terrain
27 vehicle on an all-terrain vehicle highway access route that is designated by
28 the Oregon Transportation Commission as open to all-terrain vehicles.

29 “(8) Driving privileges for Class III all-terrain vehicles are exclusively as
30 provided in ORS 821.172, unless a person is operating a Class III all-terrain

1 vehicle on an all-terrain vehicle highway access route that is designated by
2 the commission as open to all-terrain vehicles.

3 “(9) Driving privileges for Class IV all-terrain vehicles are exclusively as
4 provided in ORS 821.176, unless a person is operating a Class IV all-terrain
5 vehicle on an all-terrain vehicle highway access route that is designated by
6 the commission as open to all-terrain vehicles.

7 “(10) A person without a license or driver permit may operate a golf cart
8 in accordance with an ordinance adopted under ORS 810.070.

9 “(11) The spouse of a member of the Armed Forces of the United States
10 on active duty or the spouse of a member of the commissioned corps of the
11 National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration who is accompanying the
12 member on assignment in this state may operate a motor vehicle if the
13 spouse has a current out-of-state license or driver permit issued to the spouse
14 by another state in the spouse’s possession.

15 “(12) A person who is a member of the Armed Forces of the United States
16 on active duty or a member of the commissioned corps of the National
17 Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration may operate a motor vehicle if the
18 person has a current out-of-state license or driver permit in the person’s
19 possession that is issued to the person by the person’s state of domicile or
20 by the Armed Forces of the United States in a foreign country. Driving
21 privileges described under this subsection that are granted by the Armed
22 Forces apply only for a period of 45 days from the time the person returns
23 to the United States.

24 “(13) A person who does not hold a motorcycle endorsement may operate
25 a motorcycle if the person is:

26 “(a) Within an enclosed cab;

27 “(b) Operating a vehicle designed to travel with three wheels in contact
28 with the ground at speeds of less than 15 miles per hour; or

29 “(c) Operating an autocycle.

30 “(14) Except as provided in subsection (15) of this section, a person may

1 operate a bicycle without any grant of driving privileges.

2 “(15) A person may operate the following without any grant of driving
3 privileges if the person is [16 years of age or older] **operating:**

4 “(a) A Class 1 electric assisted bicycle **and is 14 years of age or older;**

5 “(b) A Class 2 electric assisted bicycle **and is 16 years of age or older;**
6 or

7 “(c) A Class 3 electric assisted bicycle **and is 16 years of age or older.**

8 “(16) A person may operate a motor assisted scooter without [*a driver li-*
9 *cense or driver permit*] **any grant of driving privileges** if the person is 16
10 years of age or older.

11 “(17) A person who is not a resident of this state or who has been a res-
12 ident of this state for less than 30 days may operate a motor vehicle without
13 an Oregon license or driver permit if the person is at least 15 years of age
14 and has in the person’s possession a current out-of-state equivalent of a Class
15 C instruction driver permit issued to the person. For the purpose of this
16 subsection, a person is a resident of this state if the person meets the resi-
17 dency requirements described in ORS 807.062. A person operating a motor
18 vehicle under authority of this subsection has the same privileges and is
19 subject to the same restrictions as a person operating under the authority
20 of a Class C instruction driver permit issued as provided in ORS 807.280.

21 “(18) A person may operate an electric personal assistive mobility device
22 without any grant of driving privileges if the person is 16 years of age or
23 older.

24 “(19) **A person may operate a powered micromobility device without**
25 **any grant of driving privileges if the person is 16 years of age or**
26 **older.”.**

27 On page 10, delete lines 1 and 2.

28 In line 3, delete “(3)” and insert “(2)”.

29 Delete lines 17 and 18.

30 In line 19, delete “(3)” and insert “(2)”.

1 In line 25, restore “(3)” and delete “(4)”.

2 On page 11, delete lines 26 through 45.

3 On page 12, delete lines 1 through 14 and insert:

4 “**NOTE:** Section 19 was deleted by amendment. Subsequent sections were
5 not renumbered.”.

6 In line 20, after “shall” insert “develop a safety education program and”.

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
