**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 1090**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 27 and delete pages
2 2 and 3 and insert:

3 **“SECTION 1. (1) The State Chief Information Officer shall adopt a**
4 **policy and a procedure for state agencies to follow in requesting**
5 **funding for information technology budgets and projects, including**
6 **replacements, modernizations, upgrades and expansions of information**
7 **technology systems. Each state agency that intends to request funding**
8 **for a budget or project described in this subsection shall submit the**
9 **request to the State Chief Information Officer and the office of En-**
10 **terprise Information Services for review not later than the date in**
11 **each biennium that the State Chief Information Officer specifies.**

12 **“(2) The State Chief Information Officer, in collaboration with the**
13 **Legislative Fiscal Office, shall establish criteria for assigning priorities**
14 **among the budgets and projects described in subsection (1) of this**
15 **section.**

16 **“(3) The office of Enterprise Information Services, in collaboration**
17 **with affected state agencies, shall evaluate budget and project requests**
18 **the state agencies submit under subsection (1) of this section against**
19 **the criteria that the State Chief Information Officer and Legislative**
20 **Fiscal Office specify under subsection (2) of this section. The office of**
21 **Enterprise Information Services shall then recommend for the State**

1 Chief Information Officer's approval priority rankings of the requests
2 within the context of all of each state agency's requests, the requests
3 in a program area and the requests that the executive department
4 submits as a whole. In recommending the ranking, the office of En-
5 terprise Information Services shall consider whether, and the extent
6 to which, a request:

7 “(a) Is consistent with and supports implementation of the Enter-
8 prise Information Resources Management Strategy described in ORS
9 276A.203 (4)(a)(M);

10 “(b) Involves or promotes the use of shared systems, resources or
11 data;

12 “(c) Uses commercially available systems or software;

13 “(d) Enhances the information security posture of the agency or the
14 state; and

15 “(e) Reduces system redundancies within an agency, a program area
16 or the state.

17 “(4) Not later than November 30 of the even-numbered year in each
18 biennium the State Chief Information Officer shall submit to the
19 Governor and the Joint Legislative Committee on Information Man-
20 agement and Technology a report that:

21 “(a) Lists the priority rankings described in subsection (3) of this
22 section; and

23 “(b) Includes a list of the information technology services and the
24 recommendation from the State Chief Information Officer that is re-
25 quired under ORS 276A.203 (4)(a)(L).

26 “(5) After the Legislative Assembly adopts a budget for the state,
27 the State Chief Information Officer, in collaboration with the Legis-
28 lative Fiscal Office, shall submit to the Governor and the Joint Leg-
29 islative Committee on Information Management and Technology not
30 later than October 31 of the odd-numbered year in each biennium a

1 report that lists all of the information technology budget and project
2 requests that the Legislative Assembly approved.

3 **“SECTION 2.** This 2025 Act being necessary for the immediate
4 preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
5 declared to exist, and this 2025 Act takes effect on its passage.”.

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
