**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 39**

1 On page 2 of the printed bill, line 3, delete “now, therefore,” and insert
2 “and”.

3 After line 3, insert:

4 “Whereas Sergeant Dwight Hayes of Oregon City, a United States Army
5 field illumination crewman, died from injuries sustained during an accident
6 in Phuoc Tuy Province, South Vietnam, on February 6, 1970; and

7 “Whereas Specialist Four Robert Dean Neasham of Canby, a United
8 States Army heavy vehicle driver, died from a self-inflicted wound in Binh
9 Dinh Province, South Vietnam, on October 13, 1968; and

10 “Whereas Staff Sergeant Warren Emery Newton of Canby, a helicopter
11 repairman in the United States Army, died when his helicopter was shot
12 down and exploded in Quang Tin Province, South Vietnam, on January 9,
13 1968, and he was declared MIA until his remains were recovered and identi-
14 fied in 2015; and

15 “Whereas Private First Class Curtis Neil Evans of Gladstone, a United
16 States Army infantryman, died from small arms fire in Kon Tum Province,
17 South Vietnam, on September 2, 1968; and

18 “Whereas Lance Corporal Walter David Freeman of Gladstone, a United
19 States Marine Corps rifleman, died from small arms fire in Quang Nam
20 Province, South Vietnam, on December 2, 1968; and

21 “Whereas Airman Brian Lee Bushnell of Tualatin, a structural mechanic

1 in the United States Navy, died in a crash at sea in the Gulf of Tonkin,
2 North Vietnam, on April 9, 1970; and

3 “Whereas Private First Class Robert Wayne Clarke of West Linn, a
4 United States Marine Corps rifleman, died of wounds inflicted by an ex-
5 plosive device in Quang Tri Province, South Vietnam, on August 26, 1968;
6 and

7 “Whereas Warrant Officer Allen Dean Perkins of West Linn, a helicopter
8 pilot in the United States Army, died in a helicopter crash in Bien Hoa,
9 Dong Nai Province, South Vietnam, on November 24, 1969; and

10 “Whereas Lance Corporal Steven Adrian Smith of West Linn, a United
11 States Marine Corps rifleman, died of wounds inflicted by artillery, rocket
12 or mortar fire in Quang Tri Province, South Vietnam, on October 26, 1967;
13 and

14 “Whereas Private First Class Dale William Tolbert of West Linn, a
15 United States Army infantryman, died from multiple fragmentation wounds
16 inflicted in Binh Duong Province, South Vietnam, on May 19, 1967; now,
17 therefore,”.

18 Delete lines 5 through 9 and insert:

19 “That we, the members of the Eighty-third Legislative Assembly, recog-
20 nize and honor Lieutenant Colonel Herb Doby (USAF), Second Lieutenant
21 Dale Allen Perkins (USAR), First Lieutenant Patrick Leonard Woods
