I am not interested in holding a second mortgage as the risk is to high and I don't have the years left to recoup if they default on the loan. This bill could be a help to the passing of land to the next generation of farmers:

Allows farmers to realize some of the equity in their land without selling part of the farm or selling to developers.

- Works with farmers on a voluntary basis to maintain and improve farm production while preserving ag land and conserving natural habitat.
- Technical assistance helps farmers adapt to climate change and adopt climate-friendly practices,
- Programs help farmers find the next generation to take over the land and keep it in production.
- Has broad support across the industry and bipartisan support in the legislature
