My name is Ben Gurewitz, I am speaking on behalf of Disability Rights Oregon and pleased to offer testimony in strong support of HB 2163. Disability Rights Oregon is the State's Protection and Advocacy System. We are authorized by Congress to protect, advocate, and enforce the rights of People with Disabilities. We are tasked with advancing policies that ensure that Oregonians with Disabilities can, live, work, and play in the least restrictive environment and that they can reach their fullest potential.

Razor clamming is certainly no exception. Currently, the law restricts individuals from receiving any assistance while clamming or fishing. Friends, family or

current law does not allow individuals with special needs to receive any assistance, even from family, while clamming or fishing. If a parent or friend does provide assistance, they can face penalties and fines. Based on my personal experience, current law has stopped families from getting outdoors to go clamming and fishing.
