## Testimony in Support of HB 3127

Physical certificates require the funeral home to hand-delivery and pick up the documents once they are signed. This process results in multiple trips, significantly increasing the carbon footprint associated with the certification process. Reducing the number of trips not only decreases the environmental impact but also alleviates traffic congestion in metropolitan areas. By transitioning to a digital process, we can contribute to a more sustainable and environmentally friendly practice.

## Proven Reliability of OVERS

Lastly, it is important to note that the OVERS system is not new; it has been in use for over a decade and has proven to be reliable and effective. This tried-and-true system has a track record of facilitating accurate and timely reporting.
