HB 2811: Dolly Parton's Imagination Library of Oregon

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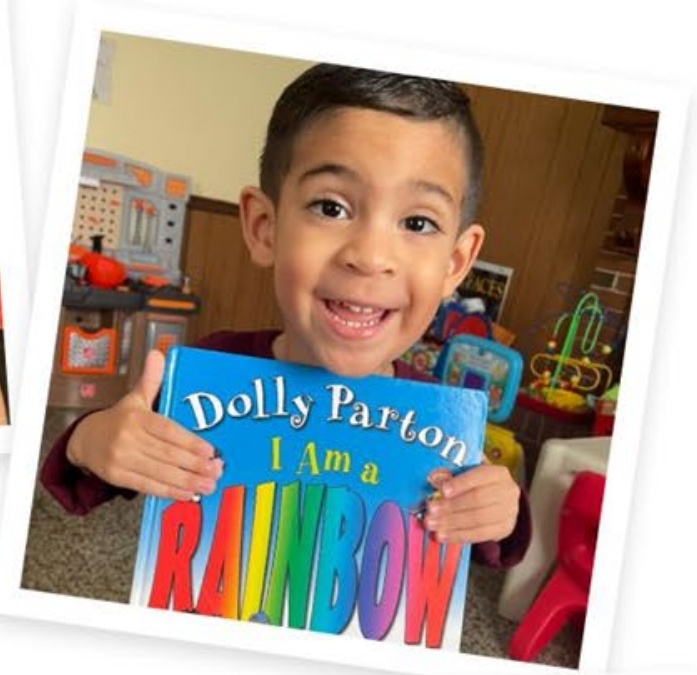


Overview

Dolly Parton's Imagination Library is a book gifting program that mails free, high-quality, age-appropriate books to children from birth to age five directly to children's homes, regardless of family income.

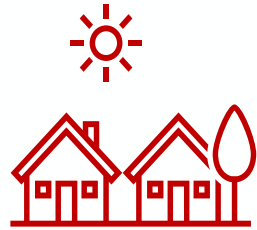

Roles



56 Local Program Partners in 36 Oregon Counties

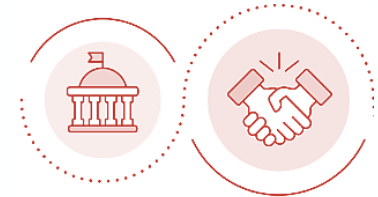
- Promote program locally
- Enroll children ages 0-5 in coverage area
- Pay 50% of funds for monthly books and mailing costs
- Manage registrations in book order system database

Dolly's Parton Imagination Library

- Covers all overhead and admin expenses
- Provides book order system database and support
- Oversees branding, book selection and pricing
- Coordinates book order and fulfillment

\$2.60 per child per month or about \$31 annually



State Program Partner

- Manages the daily operations of Oregon program
- Pays the remaining 50% of the statewide cost from the State funds
- Advances and strengthens local programs through support, marketing campaigns and fundraising

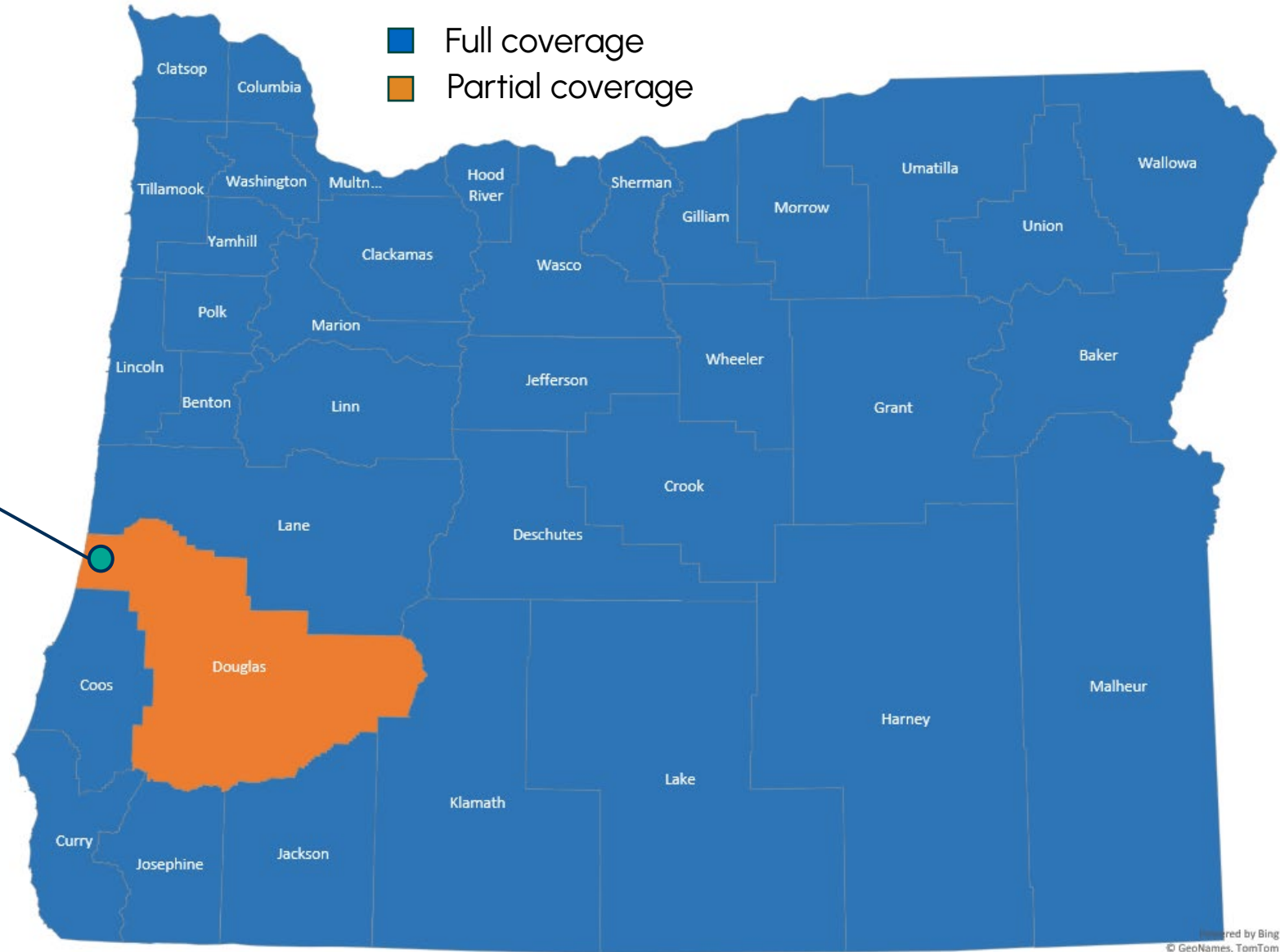


State DPIL Coverage Map

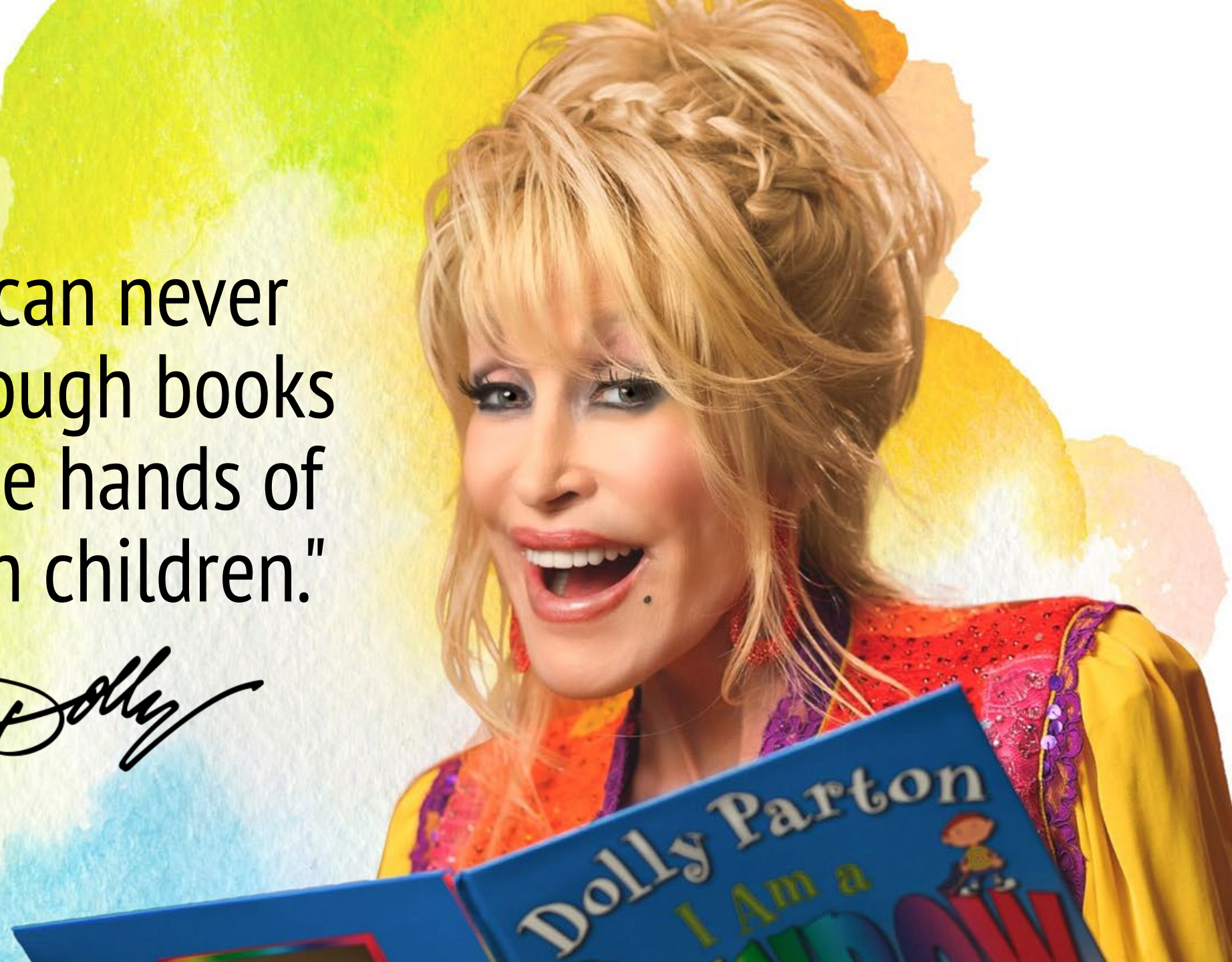
HB 2811

- Establishes the Imagination Library of Oregon program
- Authorizes the Department of Early Learning and Care to contract with a nonprofit entity to administer the Imagination Library of Oregon program, including
 - Providing the 50% match from the State for books and mailing
 - Promoting access to the program
 - Establishing community donations to expand the program
- Creates separate Oregon Imagination Library Account within the Department of Early Learning and Care
