Maintaining healthy hatchery fish stocks is crucial for Oregon's fishing and tourist industries, as well as for Oregonians who love to fish. Splitting existing license fund revenues between hatchery maintenance and monitoring the effects of hatchery fish on conservation and recovery of wild fish will help to maintain a balance between these important goals. I have read that this bill will help replace some of the General Fund reductions for ODFW monitoring. Without sufficient funds for monitoring, ODFW's fish managers cannot make informed decisions about protecting Oregon's wild fish populations, evaluate whether current management strategies are working, or make sound decisions on other budget investments.
