I am an optometric physician practicing in Oregon and I am reaching out to ask for your support in the passage of HB 2204. The bill removes the requirement that optometric physicians have hospital consulting privileges in order to qualify for a rural tax credit.

To compete with more populated areas in acquiring physicians, rural communities rely upon financial incentives such as tax credits and student loan forgiveness.

To function as intended, tax credits must be easily accessible. The requirement to have a hospital affiliation is an unnecessary barrier to many optometric physicians in rural communities. The credentialing process is arduous. It can take months or even years for small rural hospitals to establish criteria for new providers, and they often have little or no motivation to do so.

I practice in rural Oregon on the South Coast where access to care is very limited, often causing long wait times for patients. Any incentive that could potentially draw additional practitioners to our area to ease the patient burden would benefit those waiting months to be seen or simply going without essential eye care.

We support expanding access to rural healthcare and HB 2204 is a positive step forward. Thank you for your support!
