Dear Senate Health Care Committee members,

My name is Danielle Palagi, I am a below the knee amputee living in Portland, Oregon. For this

reason I wish to express my support for Senate Bill 699, which would mandate insurance

coverage for orthotic and prosthetic care necessary for physical activity for folks living with limb

loss or limb differences. Senate Bill 699 is currently pending in the Oregon Senate Health Care

Committee and we urge you to move in favor of this bill.

I am currently a 34 year old special education teacher in Portland, Oregon. I lost my right leg

below the knee at 26 years old when a semi-truck hit me while commuting home from work on

my bicycle. Activity was important, not only did I exercise but I was running with students at

work, I didn't have a car and cycling was my mode of transportation. I found out my insurance

wouldn't pay for a leg to run or bike. I found a non-profit that granted me these for me my first

years. I healed from something traumatic because I had access to proper medical devices and my

mobility back. It was essential to my job and mental health. This bill would insure that everyone

has access to the full range of mobility they deserve. Without this bill, I personally don't have a

way to access a new running or biking leg once I grow out of mine. I'm currently pregnant and

want to be able to run on the playground with my own child. Teach them how to run, bike and

whatever activity they enjoy.

Currently, prosthetic and orthotic care for physical activity is considered "not medically

necessary" and is often subject to denial by insurance companies, leaving patients without care

and responsible for paying out of pocket or relying on charity for an activity specific device.

These out- of- pocket costs can range from \$5,000 - \$250,000 for one device. These devices are

specifically designed for different types of physical activities such as running, swimming, hiking

or climbing. For those unable to access devices they can be put at risk of harm or injury when

using improper devices, or alternatively, may develop sedentary lifestyles which can lead to long

term health complications, isolation, and the development of more costly medical care. For this

reason I believe that current practices discriminate against Oregonians with disabilities and limits

their capacity to live full and healthy lives. Meanwhile, covering devices for physical activity has

a minimal impact on insurance premiums while providing long term social and fiscal benefits by

improving health access and equity for Oregonians with disabilities.

As an amputee I know that the appropriate prosthetic or orthotic device is critical for the highest

quality of life. For this reason I am in support of Senate Bill 699 and its potential to expand

access to recreational prosthesis and orthosis making it medically necessary for every body.
