Please build on the important progress at the state legislature in recent years by passing HB 2978.

As an avid outdoorsy person, I love to hike, ride my bicycle, motorcycle, offroad, etc. Interactions with wildlife are frequent enough that caution is warranted at all times when on and off road or on or off trail (in non-trailed areas). Eliminating humanwildlife interactions is impossible of course, and no one wants that anyway. But minimizing violent interactions, be it on roads at high speed or under-tire or foot at lower speeds remains imperative, and any assistance we can provide our wildlife friends is assistance we SHOULD provide.
