We here in NE Oregon, particularly Baker City, have lost our bus transportation option. We have no public transport option. LaGrande and Pendelton apparently still have bus transport available but no train as well. This country is sooo far behind Europe, China, and Japan in terms of train transport it is ridiculous. We like our independence and ability to travel by car wherever we wish, however, there are many times when being able to take the train to Boise would be of great advantage. In this area, including Baker City we have a growing number of retired folks who have moved into the area for small-town life. This is another whole sector that would use this train from Boise to Portland and Seattle, Portland Boise, and Salt Lake if we had it available.
