PCP ELECTION WORKER BILL



Please Pass HB 3387

- House Bill 3387 allows for counties to use Precinct Committee Persons (PCPs) to work on elections if hired by a county clerk's office to do so.
- County Clerks Offices staff up during elections, they are required by law to hire workers form both major political parties.
- This bill would allow for PCPs to work as staff in elections offices but would still maintain flexibility for counties to decide whether or not to hire PCPs.
- By definition in state law, a PCP is not considered a public officer (ORS 248.015 (7)).
- County security measures and multiparty election boards provide checks and balances needed to provide fair and accurate elections.
- Please consider passing HB 3387 to help provide County Clerks the flexibility to hire PCPs as needed.

The OACC represents all of the Oregon County Clerks, who are responsible for administering and funding elections.
