To Oregon Lawmakers: Please vote YES on Tensy's Law, SB 538. The bill would increase access to Oregon's Children's Extraordinary Needs (CEN) waiver; allow parents of minors to be personal support workers; and ensure this compensation comes from already-obligated funding.
