I am a volunteer on several restoration projects in natural areas of urban Portland, as well as a gardener maintaining a Platinum Certified Backyard Habitat at my own home. I strongly support HB 3173.

As a member of the Native Plant Society of Oregon I rely on the useful and useable information from OregonFlora to both enhance my appreciation of the natural world and to share that with other Oregon residents. I have personally financially supported Oregon Flora and will continue to do so. The scholarly curation of the information by the OregonFlora team means it is accurate and valuable for both professional and casual use. It is not an "ivory tower" endeavor.
