On behalf of OEA, I am writing to express strong support for HB 3169.

As educators, we see firsthand the critical role that school-based health centers (SBHCs) play in the lives of our students. HB 3169 strengthens SBHCs by introducing an inflationary adjustment to the SBHC base rate and tying it to inflation, ensuring these vital services remain sustainable.

This funding adjustment is necessary and urgent. Inflationary increases will maintain service levels, ensuring students have consistent access to critical health services that support their wellbeing and academic success.

Oregon's educators are committed to ensuring every student has the opportunity to thrive. By passing HB 3169, the Legislature can help maintain equitable healthcare access for Oregon students, setting them up for success in and out of the classroom.
