The Oregon Flora project is an invaluable resource which many specialists use to assess and ID plants, some rare some not. The project has also produced a new Oregon Flora (two volumes so far, the third still in progress) which students, professionals, Botanist, and anyone interested in plants can use to help identify all of Oregon's amazing flora. In addition to these flora identification guides which are a major achievement, there is also a most incredible website, the Oregon Flora atlas, which is an easy to use and constantly updated internet site for plant identification. I cannot imagine how I would have been able to do my job as a Botanist with the Coos Bay District Office without having access to this superlative resource.

Permanent funding for Oregon Flora is long overdue. The project has solicited funding as best they could for many years but currently is in dire need of a permanent source of funding.
