- Boarding livestock displaced by the wildfires
- Youth educational presentations
- Wildland fire camps
- Public RV Camping spaces

As commissioners we have increased Fairground funding in our budgets and through Federal COVID Relief money. These amount to band aids given the continuous costs to Fairgrounds.

Support from the State is needed to continue and improve this vital role that Fairgrounds play in the State of Oregon.
