I am a member of Salem's oldest outdoor organization, the Chemeketans, which has been an advocate for the Oregon Coast trail.

The Oregon Legislature unanimously passed HB 3149 in 2017 which called for the completion of the Oregon Coast Trail. SB 997 would be a significant boost to implementing the Oregon Coast Trail Action Plan that was completed as a result of HB 3149. Oregon is one of only three states that, by law, guarantees public access to our entire coast thanks to the Oregon Beach Bill.

The Oregon Coast Trail will attract avid hikers from not only from Oregon and the Northwest, but also from around the world. Completion of the trail will boost the stature of the Oregon Coast Trail similar to world recognized trails in Europe, New Zealand, Australia, and Japan.
