The following was presented at the committee meeting on Feb. 5, 2025:

"Co-chairs Helm & Owens, Vice-chair McDonald, and members of the committee: My name is Kristy Athens, I live in Wallowa County, and I'm here to talk about the value to rural Oregon of House Bill 2979.

"I founded a food hub in 2020 called Good Groceries, which basically brings the farmers market to you. This model is popular with folks who support local businesses, value high-quality food, and appreciate the convenience of home delivery. I operate in Wallowa and Union counties, and purchase products from small ag businesses across Oregon and Washington.

"Last year Good Groceries received a Food Hub Infrastructure grant that supported major upgrades to the warehouse: a refrigerated cargo van, walk-in cooler, and energy-efficient freezers. This game-changer is still revealing its advantages, but I can report that the van allows me to safely and professionally deliver more orders in one trip; and to buy more food, both at one time and overall, from local farms. The new appliances store more items with better organization, enabling superior food-safety protocols.

"Because of these improvements, Good Groceries continues to grow. In 2024, I added 158 customers and 12 new vendors, resulting in an increase of 25% in gross revenue over 2023, and a 261% increase over Year One. Up to 80% of the price of a product goes to the farmer, rancher, fisher, or maker who produced it; last year I paid them more than \$53,000.

"Good Groceries is an LLC but functions more like a community service project. It is, to my knowledge, the only certified Benefit Company in Eastern Oregon. Good Groceries donates \$1 of each sale to local food pantries; in 2024 I sent \$645 to help feed our community.

"Without OCFSN, this equipment would have been out of reach for years. This funding helps Good Groceries support resiliency in Northeast Oregon. Thank you."
