My name is John Herrera, and I serve as Director of Catholic Charities Immigration Legal Services, one of Oregon's oldest and largest immigration legal services non-profits.

Catholic Charities of Oregon enthusiastically supports HB 2586, tuition equity for asylum seekers.

I wish this program had been in place when I fled my home country, Colombia. At the time I fled more than 20 years ago, I was serving as chief of staff to an elected official. When he was killed and my life was threatened, I had no choice but to leave my home and the people I loved.

As a survivor of political violence and as someone forced from their beloved home country due to political corruption and the deliberate extermination of leaders like me, I am grateful for the opportunities this country offers.

I remain truly surprised, however, that we Oregonians still charge asylum seekers out-of-state or international tuition, cruelly keeping higher education out of reach for these brave neighbors of ours.

My story is in many ways a happy one. As an asylee, I worked my way through the ranks at Catholic Charities, learning English and the U.S. immigration system until I eventually became Director of Immigration Legal Services.

That said, as an asylum seeker, then asylee and as a person of color, exclusion and marginalization are norms that are too often a part of life in the United States. I urge you all, Democrats and Republicans, to support HB 2586, and welcome courageous asylum seekers into our higher education communities.
