Right now, the hands of those communities are tied, as the most effective strategy—hound hunting—remains prohibited statewide. If a county decides it needs hound hunting to restore balance, fine. If not, nothing changes for them. This is how we can respect Oregon's diversity while ensuring a fair policy.
