I attend meetings with parents, resource parents, educators, school officials, social workers, lawyers, and mental health providers. All of this enables me to submit a report to the judge who will determine whether the children return to their parents' care or are granted adoption or guardianship. The judge relies on CASA volunteers to provide them with this vital information. CASA volunteers are advocates for the children we serve. It is a lot of work that is worth it to know that these children who have been abused and/or neglected will get a chance to survive, to heal, and to grow. The local CASA offices provide both initial and continuing training to volunteers, in addition to coordination with ODHS, the local court, and the service providers, both public and private, who assist our children.
