I support SB 769. I believe that each area is different and there are certainly Counties where cougar populations are definitely on the rise and farmers/ranchers and even some people on the outskirts of town are seeing animals killed. More and more cougars are being caught on game cameras closer in to town than they normally are. I've seen a decline in deer and elk populations where we hunt and it's attributed to cougars.

By allowing individual counties to decide whether to permit hound hunting, we give local communities a voice while still respecting the importance of cougars in our ecosystem. This approach is not about wiping out cougars; it's about maintaining sustainable wildlife populations and responsibly managing Oregon's natural resources.

We must control animal populations however when one of our most effective ways of safely taking an animal is restricted then the effectiveness of population control goes down. Our sanctioned hunters are just too busy to be effective with all of the requests put in around the state.
