Measure SB769

I am here to strongly advocate for Measure SB 769. The plummeting decrease of the population of deer and elk in our state is directly correlated to the abundance of cougars (and bears). The habitat in our beautiful state of Oregon has not changed so much that it would affect the deer and elk population to this degree. To preserve our ecologic equilibrium, we must control the cougar population. We must choose to keep our communities safe as well as our livestock and farming communities.
