I am writing to express my strong support for House Bill 3155, which proposes permitting the operation of Class I, Class III, and Class IV all-terrain vehicles (ATVs) on non-interstate highways in Oregon, provided these vehicles meet specific equipment standards and are duly registered.

Currently, Oregon restricts ATV usage on paved roads and two-lane gravel roads unless explicitly posted as open. This limitation poses challenges for ATV enthusiasts and professionals who rely on these vehicles for both recreational and occupational purposes. By allowing ATVs on certain highways, HB 3155 offers several advantages:
