For the record, my name is Marie Dodds, and I am here today on behalf of AAA Oregon/Idaho to speak in support of HB 2154, a measure that makes the county safety corridor program permanent. For more than 100 years, AAA has been an advocate for transportation safety and dedicated to helping travelers with roadside assistance, travel and insurance services, discounts, and additional transportation resources.

The county safety corridor program has proven to be an effective tool in enhancing road safety by implementing targeted measures such as increased enforcement, improved signage, enhanced road design, and public education initiatives. Data from existing safety corridors demonstrates a significant reduction in severe crashes in these designated areas. By making this program permanent, HB 2154 ensures that counties have the continued ability to identify high-risk roadways and implement life-saving interventions.

Oregon continues to face challenges in addressing roadway fatalities and serious injuries, particularly in rural areas where high-speed roadways and limited emergency response resources can exacerbate crash severity.
