Currently, Oregon hands out thousands of cougar tags each year, yet the actual harvest numbers remain extremely low. Hound hunting was once a proven and selective method for harvesting cougars before it was banned statewide. By allowing individual counties to decide whether to permit hound hunting, we give local communities a voice while still respecting the importance of cougars in our ecosystem. This approach is not about wiping out cougars; it's about maintaining sustainable wildlife populations and responsibly managing Oregon's natural resources.
