It is Deja vu all over again as the citizens of Oregon must oppose another attempt by hound hunters to reverse the ban on hound hunting of cougars that was passed as Measure 18 twice in the 1990s! What is it that these hounds men cannot understand "No " to reversal of the ban county by county.

This is far from a fair chase or ethical hunt.
