At this camp, they are surrounded by peers and staff who understand their unique challenges, creating a space where they can express themselves freely, develop friendships, and experience the joy of independence.

The camp is also a powerful learning experience for graduate students training in speech language pathology and related fields. By working closely with campers, they gain hands-on clinical experience that deepens their understanding of augmentative and alternative communication (AAC) in real-world settings. This immersive experience shapes them into more skilled and compassionate professionals, which benefits future AAC users as well.

Families, too, find a vital support system at camp. Parents and caregivers often feel isolated in their experiences. Many have reported not feeling included in their public school communities themselves. But through this community, they can connect, share resources, and support one another. The camp is not a getaway but rather a transformative experience for campers, future clinicians, and families alike.
