Re: Support for HB 2698

Chair Marsh, Vice-Chairs Anderson and Breese-Iverson, and Members of the Committee:

Sisters Habitat for Humanity strongly urges your support of HB 2698, which establishes a statewide goal for homeownership.

Homeownership is a priority for the majority of Oregonians. It is a time-tested means of building generational wealth and a reliable way to improve racial and economic equity. As Oregon strives to significantly increase housing production, a statewide homeownership goal will keep housing and homeownership top of mind for decision-makers at all levels of government.

Sisters Habitat for Humanity has striven for more than three decades to create and maintain affordable housing in our community. Adding to the affordable housing supply in Sisters is far beyond a daunting challenge. The lack of available land plus the significant increase in land cost over the last three years makes it virtually impossible for Sisters Habitat to build more affordable homes in Sisters after June 2027 when we will complete our current projects. Providing a state housing goal will go a long way in supporting local organizations garner the needed resources to effectively address the affordable housing shortage.

Oregon has one of the lowest homeownership rates in the nation. According to Census data, Oregon's homeownership rate hovers near 64 percent, ranking Oregon 43rd in the nation [American Census Survey Homeownership Data]. We can do better.

Seventy-four percent of Oregonians who currently rent consider achieving homeownership one of the highest priorities in their lives (48 percent) or at least a moderate life priority (26 percent). These numbers are even higher among younger generations (81-88 percent for Gen Z, Millennials, and Gen X) and Black, Indigenous, Latino/a/x, and People of Color (96 percent)

Oregon Realtors Statewide Housing Survey].

While there are many things Oregon can do to increase homeownership and begin to close existing homeownership gaps, one thing we can do immediately is establish a statewide homeownership goal in statute. As our state works to increase housing supply at a variety of income levels, HB 2698 will help to center Oregonians' aspirations to plant roots in their local communities and begin to enjoy the many benefits of homeownership.
