Dear Chair Neron, Vice-Chairs Dobson and McIntire, and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for your commitment to strengthening Oregon's education system. I am writing today in strong support of House Bill 3200, which seeks to expand scholarship funding for aspiring educators and further diversify Oregon's teacher workforce—both culturally and linguistically.

The need for a more representative teacher workforce in Oregon is clear. While 42% of Oregon's students—more than 227,000—are from communities of color, the number of teachers from these communities remains disproportionately low, with only 4,400 educators of color statewide. This gap has direct implications for student success. Research consistently shows that a diverse teaching workforce benefits all students, particularly students of color. Representation in the classroom is linked to higher academic achievement, increased engagement, a stronger sense of belonging, and lower dropout rates.

By increasing scholarship funding for future educators, HB 3200 takes a meaningful step toward addressing this imbalance. Financial barriers should not prevent talented, passionate individuals from pursuing careers in education—especially when their presence in the classroom has a proven positive impact on student outcomes. This investment will not only help aspiring teachers but will also shape a more inclusive, equitable, and effective education system for Oregon's students.

I urge the Committee to support HB 3200 and invest in a teaching workforce that reflects the diversity of our students. Thank you for your time and leadership on this critical issue.
