Increased Deflection Program Funding for Small/Rural Counties

Chair Prozanski, Chair Kropf and members of the committee,

For the record, my name is Travis Johnson. I am the Malheur County Sheriff and I am here today on behalf of the **Oregon State Sheriffs' Association (OSSA)** and the **Oregon Association Chiefs of Police (OACP)** in strong support of SB 782, which ensures a minimum of \$500,000 in funding for rural, small counties to establish and sustain deflection programs under **HB 4002**.

Rural communities are eager to implement these programs to address substance use, reduce recidivism, and connect individuals to treatment rather than incarceration. However, the original funding cap of \$150,000 has proven insufficient to cover the costs of launching and maintaining these vital initiatives. Increasing the minimum allocation to \$500,000 will ensure rural counties have the necessary resources to successfully build and sustain these programs, ultimately improving public safety and community health.

Malheur County estimates a cost of \$370,000 to maintain our deflection program at a minimal level throughout the 2025-2027 biennium, relying on support from our mental health provider and local law enforcement agencies. With funding at the \$500,000 level, rural, small-county programs can develop and sustain these critical initiatives at a more effective and impactful level.

We urge your **full support of SB 782** to provide rural communities with the tools they need to make a lasting impact. Thank you for your time and consideration.
