Testimony in Support of SB 551

Chair Sollman, Vice Chair Smith, and Members of the Senate Committee on Energy and Environment,

I am writing today in support of SB 551, a crucial step toward reducing plastic waste and protecting Oregon's environment.

Oregon has long been a leader in environmental policy, and SB 551 aligns with our state's commitment to sustainability. By reducing reliance on single-use plastics, we take a significant step toward cleaner communities, healthier ecosystems, and a more responsible economy.

I urge this committee to support SB 551 and move Oregon forward in the fight against plastic waste.
