For instance, reimbursement rates can be up to 50% less for the same procedures compared to other licensed doctors. In addition to reimbursement disparities, naturopathic physicians face significant challenges with student loan repayment. The average salary for a naturopathic physician in Oregon is approximately \$109,867 per year. Given the substantial student loan debt incurred during their education, this income often proves insufficient to manage loan repayment effectively.

Addressing the reimbursement disparities faced by naturopathic physicians is crucial for ensuring that patients have access to preventative care and the healthcare provider of their choice. I urge you to consider supporting legislative efforts aimed at achieving pay parity. By doing so, we can promote a more equitable healthcare system that benefits both providers and patients alike.
