On behalf of the Portland Housing Bureau (PHB), I am writing to express our support for House Bill 3235. This bill is an important tool in addressing the challenges faced by first-time home buyers, particularly those from low-income households.

We believe that supporting organizations like the Network for Oregon Affordable Housing (NOAH) that help first time home buyers build equity quickly is crucial. NOAH helps make homes more affordable for low-income families, which is important for building stable communities.

The bill's focus on providing financial assistance to low-income households and ensuring affordability restrictions are maintained is vital for encouraging long-term stability in our city.
