RE: Testimony in Support of SB 822

Dear Chair Senator Patterson, Vice-Chair Senator Hayden, and Members of the Committee,

On behalf of the Oregon Association of Acupuncturists, I write in strong support of SB 822, which seeks to improve regulatory oversight of network adequacy in private health insurance plans. This bill represents an essential step toward ensuring that all Oregonians, regardless of their insurance provider, have meaningful access to the healthcare they need.

Currently, the lack of adherence to network adequacy requirements poses a significant barrier to care. While existing regulations are intended to guarantee that patients have timely and reasonable access to medical services, enforcement has often fallen short. In the field of acupuncture and other complementary medicine, patients often face significant challenges in obtaining coverage and finding in-network providers. Ensuring network adequacy is not just about compliance; it is about upholding the fundamental right of every Oregonian to receive timely and appropriate healthcare. SB 822 is a step in the right direction, and we urge your support for its passage.
