I am a teacher in the public school system in Oregon. I work in a school that with a high number of students who qualify for disability. I see first hand what the devistating effects of the cap on funding special education needs is, not only on the students who have qualified for Special Education services, but also on the general student body. Teachers, staff and administration in our building cannot sit by while a student who has a special education designation is underserved YET filling the gaps left by the funding cap means that services are shifted away from students who don't have the special education designation.
