

To: House Committee on Education From: Advocates for Disability Supports Re: Support for HB 2953 (2025)

Chair Neron, Vice Chairs Dobson and McIntire, and Members of the Committee,

My name is Lisa Ledson, and I am here on behalf of Advocates for Disability Supports, a grassroots, parent-led organization dedicated to ensuring children with disabilities receive the services they need to thrive. Most of the children we advocate for access their education through Individualized Education Programs (IEPs).

We strongly support **HB 2953** and the **-3 amendment** as an essential accountability tool. It is time to eliminate the funding cap entirely and fully support students with disabilities in Oregon.

A fully funded education is an investment in the future of individuals with disabilities. When students receive the instruction, therapies, and resources necessary for success, they develop independence, employment skills, and the ability to participate meaningfully in their communities. Without proper support, they face barriers that limit opportunities and increase reliance on social services.

Oregon's funding cap limits resources, making it harder for schools to provide legally required support. Instead of ensuring services are readily available, districts, educators, and families must fight for them. Some claim that removing the cap will incentivize over-identification of students with disabilities. As someone who has participated in more than a hundred IEP meetings over the past five years, I can

confidently say this claim is unfounded. Anyone familiar with the IEP process knows the extensive evaluations, documentation, and eligibility criteria involved.

No other student group faces a funding cap. We do not restrict funding for reading interventions or language support, so there is no justification for limiting resources for students with disabilities. Schools cannot meet their legal obligations under IDEA if funding does not reflect actual student needs.

Investing in education now reduces reliance on government services and increases opportunities for independence and employment. The -3 amendment ensures accountability and transparency, directing funding where it is needed most.

Please fully support HB 2953 and remove the funding cap once and for all.
