I can smell the raceway and I can definitely hear it as well and I highly suspect that my daughter in high school and I have been breathing their lead exhaust since we moved to the neighborhood in 2012

If you would like to provide funding for blood testing I would urge you to randomly ask for volunteers who have lived in the area at least 8 years or more.

One person's recreation at lower cost should not burden someone with the severe poisoning of lead.

Removal of lead from gasoline will simply mean an equal playing field for all the vehicles

There should be random testing and prosecution of anyone found burning lead fuel at the raceway... Lead is extremely to detect with even the cheapest testing kits found at Fred Meyer at Lombard and Interstate avenue

There should also be air quality testing for lead throughout the racing season and those sensors are extremely cost efficient when you consider the cost of not testing

Recent data Revelations have shown that North Portland already carries an extra heavy burden for the lead lined utility cables and we don't need the added burden of recreational lead for people who like to play with their big and little race cars
