Re: <u>SB 604</u> – Establishes the Strong Start Program – **Support**

SB604 would continue providing funding for the Strong Start Program within the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for purposes of providing support to first-year and underrepresented students at public universities in this state. This is consistent with the League of Women Voters of Oregon position: **Through sustaining equitable access and a seamless path from preK to postsecondary education, more Oregon students will prosper**.

Underrepresented students include those who are eligible for federal Pell Grants, as well as rural and BIPOC students.

The program was begun in 2021, and according to the Higher Education Coordinating Council, participating students (have) had higher retention rates, stronger GPAs, and completed more credit hours compared to their non-participating counterparts. Moreover, the program's focus on serving BIPOC students and students from underserved communities highlights the commitment to addressing equity in higher education.

The League applauds this initiative, and would like to see it continue.

We urge your support for SB 604.
