Private Initiated Search and Rescue Requirements

Chair Kropf and members of the committee,

Thank you for the opportunity to speak today. For the record, my name is **Brad O'Dell.** I am the Undersheriff of the Douglas County Sheriff's Office. I am here today on behalf of the **Oregon State Sheriffs' Association (OSSA)** to testify in **strong support of HB 2668 with adoption of the dash 2 amendment**. This legislation establishes **clear guidelines for private search parties**, ensuring that families of missing persons receive **transparent information** and that **law enforcement is properly notified** of independent search efforts. These provisions are critical to **public safety, coordination, and accountability** in missing persons cases.

HB 2668-2 introduces key requirements for private search parties, including:

- Mandatory disclosures to immediate family members, both verbally and in writing, stating that the private search party is not acting as an agent of law enforcement or a public search and rescue entity.
- Requiring search parties to inform families if they **intend to charge fees**, **solicit donations**, **or profit from search-related productions**.
- A requirement that private search parties notify the local sheriff's office at least 72 hours before initiating a search, providing essential information such as their identity, qualifications, search timeframe, use of dogs, and any financial disclosures made to the family.

These measures are necessary to protect vulnerable families from misinformation or financial exploitation, enhance coordination between private search efforts and law enforcement, and promote effective, ethical search practices. OSSA supports this legislation as a step toward ensuring greater accountability and improved outcomes in missing persons cases.

We urge your **full support of HB 2668-2** to enhance **public trust, safety, and coordination in Oregon's search and rescue efforts**.
