



## Children's Public Private Partnership (CP3)

Mobilizing local communities, in partnership with the Oregon Department of Human Services (ODHS) to safely reduce the number of children in foster care and create healthy, stable, and inclusive environments for families and communities to thrive.

### OVERVIEW

CP3 and ODHS have undertaken joint planning, coordination, and implementation of efforts with community partners to safely reduce the number of children in the foster care system.

#### --- WHAT ---

- Safe, timely and successful family reunification for children in foster care
- Improved collaboration between ODHS and other public and private community- based organizations
- Effective, and sustainable community-based supports for children and families
- Community-informed impact to CW systems change, policy/practice

#### --- WHY ---

Exiting foster care swiftly is essential. The trauma of separation from family and being placed into foster care increases a child's likelihood to experience

- chronic health, mental health,
- substance use issues, incarceration,
- and homelessness

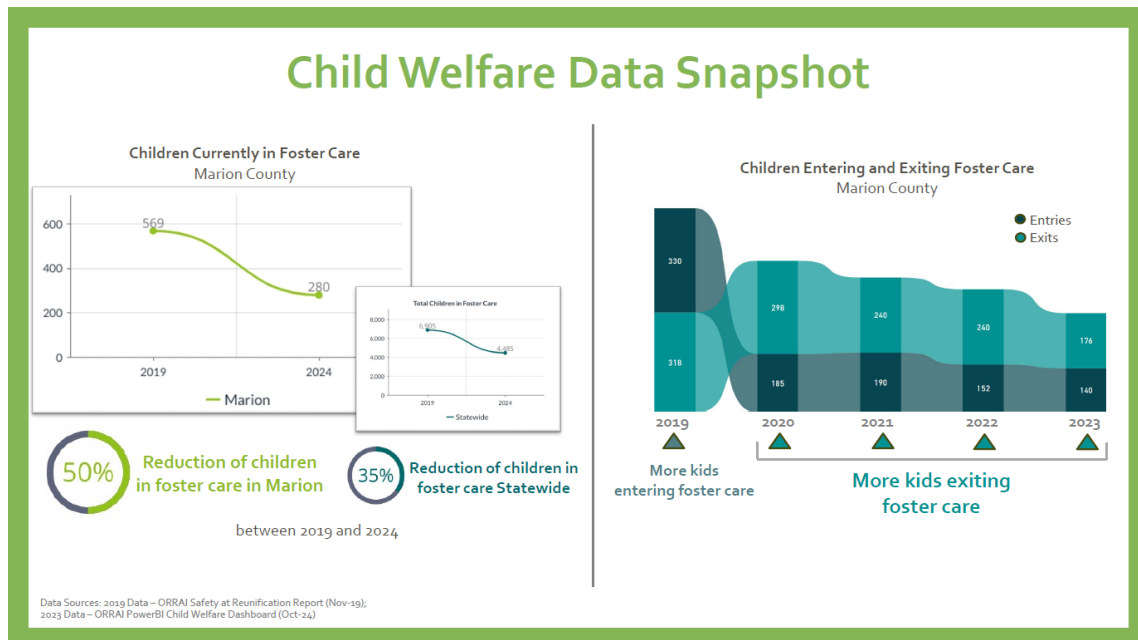


## Reduction of Children in Foster Care

In Marion County 2019-2024

- 50% reduction of children in foster care
- Compared to 35% statewide
- There continues to be more kids exiting foster care than entering

While CP3 is not solely responsible for this trend, our work contributes in many ways.

- Continue efforts in current counties (Douglas and Marion) working towards sustained impact – local ownership, relationships, systemic change
- Expand this partnership and model to achieve greater widespread impact across Oregon, reaching more counties, communities, children and families
- Replicate our implementation model in 2 new counties by 2027
