Subject: Support for HB 2554 – Social Work Licensure Compact

Dear Chair Nosse, Vice-Chair's Javadi and Nelson, and Members of the Committee,

My name is Rani, and I am a licensed clinical social worker in Oregon. I am writing to express my strong support for House Bill 2554, which would allow Oregon to join the Social Work Licensure Compact.

I entered the field of social work over ten years ago with a desire to serve the communities I am a part of. I repeatedly heard dear friends, acquaintances, and community members express frustration at the limited number of mental health providers who had similar backgrounds as them and who were also highly skilled, actually had availability, and didn't have a known dual relationship. Given the limited number of licensed BIPOC providers in the state of Oregon, finding a provider with the aforementioned criteria has been a challenge for many folks I either personally know, have worked with, or used to work with.

Like many of my colleagues, I have witnessed firsthand the growing demand for social work services in our state. Burnout is at an all-time high, and we simply do not have enough social workers to meet the needs of all Oregonians. By joining the compact, we can help address this crisis by making it easier for qualified professionals to work in Oregon, reducing barriers to licensure, and expanding the social work workforce.

This bill would also provide much-needed relief for existing social workers by increasing our professional mobility. Many of us have family in other states or want the flexibility to work across state lines through telehealth. HB 2554 would streamline

this process and ensure that Oregon remains a competitive and attractive place for social workers.

I strongly urge you to support this legislation so that Oregon can take a crucial step toward addressing our social work shortage and improving access to care. Thank you for your time and consideration.
