Re: House Bill SB 754 - Support

Chair Taylor, Vice Chair Bonham, and members of the committee:

On behalf of the more than 6,300 members of the American Association of University Professors in Oregon, our collective bargaining chapters at the University of Oregon, Portland State University, Oregon State University, and Oregon Tech, and our faculty members in advocacy chapters across Oregon, we urge you to support SB 754.

If passed, SB 754 would build off the solid foundation created in <u>HB 2016 (2019)</u> to ensure that labor organizations representing Oregon's academic workforce can operate effectively and without unnecessary delays or obstacles from the public institutions. SB 754 would accomplish this by creating financial penalties if the employer consistently fails to provide bargaining unit information or dues deductions within the timeframe set out in ORS 243.804 and 243.806. This bill also acknowledges that mistakes can and will occur by allowing for a written warning upon a first violation, so any institution that does incur a financial penalty has established a pattern of failing to meet their obligations to their unionized academic workforce.

The organizing work of our unions relies on our public institutions providing accurate and timely information about new additions to the bargaining unit. With this information, our unions are able to rapidly reach out to new hires to better connect them to the university community, help them navigate the many complications that arise as they are being onboarded, and supply them with information about the protections secured through our collective bargaining agreements. This work is stymied when public institutions fail to supply new hire information in a timely manner. Furthermore, dues deductions facilitate the operations of our unions, and our members choose to support their union financially because they know that collective power creates better faculty working conditions and student learning conditions. Any institution that consistently delays the distribution of these funds disregards the will of our members and undermines the work that we do in the interest of the students, staff, and faculty of our public institutions.

Please support SB 754. Thank you for your consideration.
