- Established in 1926 with more than 200 wheat growers, handlers, grain millers and marketers.
- Created the first wheat commodity organization in the United States.
- Born out of the commitment of farmers who understood the strength of community and cooperation.
- Named the Oregon Wheat Growers League, following its creation in 1926.
- February 11, 2026 will mark the 100-year anniversary of the organization providing a space to share information about farming practices, marketing, grain transportation and advancements in wheat research- all things that make Oregon wheat what it is today.
